

- Veronica Chan (President): Wanted to hear about door code change? Who wants their door code changed, and who doesn't want their door code changed? Not a clear answer from each club as to what they want to do can message Veronica, or vote now
  - In Favour of Change BUGS and BSA
  - Oppose ChemClub, WatRox, SBSA, MNS
  - Abstain PhysClub
- Yilda Boukhtouchen (PhysClub): How would the door code policy change if it did change and can we improve the situation so we don't have the issue that warrants a door code change again?
- Veronica Chan (President): Firstly, we should make a list of who knows the door code and who has access to the room
- Akshay Jogoo (VPFA): Why do we have to change all the codes?
- Veronica Chan (President): Faculty wants it
- Victor Pham-Ho (BSA): SMT was changed, so why can't two more rooms be changed
- Meghan Thomson (WatRox): ChemClub and WatRox are not under the constitution technically, and last time they changed the door code without letting anyone know
- Veronica Chan (President): Will ask for BSA specifically, can you talk about your situation?
- Victor Pham-Ho (BSA): Previous Apple incidence. Have large volume, and less security way beyond our control, messy, loss of things or things are getting moved,
- BUGS: Lots of people going in there really late at night, taking things and leaving a mess
- Kellie Karim (Financial Assoc.): What is the harm in changing all of them?
- Oz (MNS): Lessen the volume of people coming in, want to grow MNS numbers
- Akshay Jogoo (VPFA): When people know the door code its convenient best case scenario is to change the two door codes only
- Meghan Thomson (WatRox): Our space is more of a lounge than a club space, free to come and go as they please, we have a locker for our stuff (things for execs, or stuff left over from events)

- Victor Pham-Ho (BSA): We operate the same way, but there is stuff that we have for everyone too. Used to have plushies and there was chalk or cheeto dust on our stuff. Main reason for the change is so that people respect the room.
- Akshay Jogoo (VPFA): Went to PhysClub, and it was not clean, so they wrote it on the wall, maybe do that to enforce rules?
- Meghan Thomson (WatRox): We had dishes in the past, janitors said if you don't clean dishes we are going to remove your sink maybe try and be passive aggressive to respect the room
- Veronica Chan (President): When I propose the issue, please make a document with everyone that has the club door code and share it with SciSoc so we know who has the code (write on document "give to everyone" if everyone has access to the code)
