**Rationale and Background for Change(s)**

The main beneficiaries of the change are students, who benefit by (i) more ways to satisfy requirements, (ii) more clarity about what each requirement is for, and (iii) a stronger knowledge base in an area of concentration. The new breadth requirements "List 1" will be more straightforward for students to complete as they increase the number of options (separating out Cognitive Psychology and Neuroscience, adding Anthropology, and making the CS option easier to satisfy). The new concentration requirements "List 2" ensure that students gain a deep understanding of one area, which was not previously required as the 'List 2' requirement could be satisfied by taking introductory courses in different areas. We are also adding more courses without extensive prerequisites to make the minor easier to complete. Finally, the research/seminar requirement "List 3" ensures that students get a small-class or research experience as part of their program. The learning outcomes of the minor are not changing.

**Consultations (Departmental)**

Emails were sent on Dec 13 to the Associate Chairs, Undergraduate (or equivalent) for each of the 15 departments outside Psychology whose courses are listed on either the old or new version of the requirements. We received favorable responses with minor suggestions from APPLS, BIOL, CS, KIN, and MSE. In addition, CS, PHIL, and PSYCH are represented on the Cognitive Science committee that drafted these changes.

**Rationale and Background for Change(s)** ⓘ

We are removing the required capstone (RCS499) and replacing it with any RCS course at the 300- or 400-level.

Because of low numbers of majors, RCS499 Senior Seminar (which is restricted to majors) has been consistently a low enrolment course. The average annual enrolment over the last 15 years is 2 students. Thus, the course has typically not counted towards faculty teaching load. Given the current budget and teaching pressures, it is not a viable course.

Over the past eight years, an average of eight 300 or 400 level courses per year (not counting RS499) have been offered, either by Religious Studies faculty or by faculty in other programs teaching courses cross-listed with RCS. Even though this number will be reduced due to retirements not being replaced, we believe there will be enough courses at these levels to ensure that students can meet the requirement for one additional 300- or 400-level course even if they become majors only in their third year or even in their fourth year. These courses exhibit a range of methods in the study of religion, culture, and spirituality, many of which provide students with seminar opportunities.

We considered adding some kind of milestone such as requiring majors to write a paper in which they would reflect on their learning throughout the program. However, since such milestones are very rare in undergraduate Arts programs, we determined this could be a barrier for students, and may be difficult for faculty and staff to administer.

Through the advising process, those Honours students planning on graduate studies will be encouraged to take one or more RS398 course (Directed Readings) with a relevant faculty member from the department. Given limited faculty resources and student interest (only a small number of majors plan on further studies), this is best way to prepare such students for graduate work.
