### **Assistant Professor Position in Crime, Law, and Security**

The Department of Sociology and Legal Studies in the Faculty of Arts at the University of Waterloo is seeking an exceptional scholar, teacher, and researcher for a tenure track position at the rank of Assistant Professor in the area of Crime, Law, and Security beginning July 1, 2019.

The successful candidate must have a PhD in Sociology or cognate discipline. Evidence of an active research program in the Department's thematic area of Crime, Law, and Security and the ability to contribute to the Department's core strength in social theory or methodology at the undergraduate or graduate level are required. Duties will include teaching courses at the undergraduate and graduate level in the area of Crime, Law, and Security, developing courses to bridge the Sociology and Legal Studies undergraduate curricula, teaching social theory or methods at the undergraduate or graduate level, and supervising graduate students in Sociology. The ability to develop and teach an array of traditional and on-line courses is required.

The Department of Sociology and Legal Studies is a research-intensive department with diverse academic programs examining many of the most pressing issues confronting societies today. The Department offers undergraduate and graduate degrees (MA and PhD) in Sociology and is home to an interdisciplinary undergraduate Legal Studies program. The Department provides an intellectually vibrant setting for students and faculty engaging in sociological and socio-legal scholarship and is committed to developing a culture of academic and professional mentorship among students and faculty. Recent growth and change in the faculty complement builds on the Department's foundational strengths in social theory and research methods while advancing research and scholarship in the following four thematic areas: Crime, Law, and Security; Knowledge, Education, and Digital Culture; Migration, Borders, and Transnationalism; and Social Inequality and Public Policy.

The salary range for this position at the Assistant Professor rank is \$80,000 to \$100,000. Negotiations beyond this salary range will be considered for exceptionally qualified candidates.
