

Course Sequencing

You are encouraged to take required courses at your current academic level (100-levels in 1A and 1B, 200-levels in 2A and 2B, and so on), when they are being offered throughout your progression, and then choose your electives. You may take courses in your academic plans (majors, minors), BA breadth requirement courses, or electives that can be counted towards your BA degree requirements.

Year 1: SOC 101, LS 101, BA breadth requirements

Year 2: SOC 202, SOC/LS 221, SOC/LS 280, SOC and LS additional courses at 200-level, BA breadth requirements (if not already completed)

<u>Year 3:</u> LS 300/SOC 370, SOC 302, SOC/LS 322, SOC and LS additional courses at 300-level, unique SOC major courses, unique LS major courses

Year 4: SOC 4XX theory seminar, SOC and LS additional courses at 400-level, unique SOC major courses (if not already completed), and unique LS major courses (if not already completed)
