St. Jerome's University in the University of Waterloo is accepting applications for volunteers to serve on our Board of Governors.

Our Board benefits from the broad experience of its members and seeks individuals who are familiar with working in diverse and complex environments. Demonstrated experience or expertise in areas such as fundraising, finance and accounting, law, governance, human resources and labour relations are among the experiences that would contribute to the strength of our Board. Familiarity with catholic values and traditions is expected of all board members.

Board positions are for three-year terms, typically commencing on July 1st. Members are committed to serving St. Jerome's University by attending Board meetings, briefings, and workshops, serving as a member on one of the Board's five (5) committees, and by attending major University events as necessary. In addition, the Board provides opportunities and encourages its members to assume leadership role(s) within the Board. St. Jerome's University and the University of Waterloo reside and operate on the traditional territory of the Attawandaron, Anishinaabeg, and Haudenosaunee peoples. The University is situated on the Haldimand Tract, the land Frederick Haldimand granted to the Haudenosaunee of the Six Nations of the Grand River in 1784 that includes 10 kilometers on both sides of the Grand River and extends from its source to Lake Erie.

St. Jerome's University is a publicly funded Roman Catholic university federated with the University of Waterloo. The University is committed to fostering a culture of inclusion and belonging within the University community. Building an inclusive community with a shared purpose is something that St. Jerome's prioritizes. We believe it is important for our Board to reflect the diversity of our students and community. The University seeks qualified candidates who share our commitment to equity and inclusion, who will contribute to the diversification of ideas and perspectives, and especially welcomes applications from indigenous (First Nations, Métis or Inuit) peoples, members of racialized communities, persons with disabilities, women, and persons who identify as 2SLGBTQIA+. Per the St. Jerome's University Act of Incorporation, this position requires candidates to be a Canadian citizen.
