How to Network Virtually

- Turn on your camera! People like to talk face to face
- Use the chat feature to respond to questions and react to the comments of others
- Have LinkedIn open to make new connections right away
- When engaging in a conversation with someone else, try to keep yourself unmuted to easily respond if circumstances allow that.
- Do some research prior to our event and learn more about the organizations attending
- Make a list of standard short ice breaker questions to become comfortable with whoever you are networking with.
- Stay calm and have fun. Most importantly, be yourself and take comfort in knowing that others are in a similar position to you.

What questions should I ask?

Icebreakers:

- What exactly does your work entail?
- How long have you been working in this position?
- What is your academic background?
- What's the most interesting project that you've worked on?

Learn more about where you can fit in:

- What kind of opportunities do you have at your organization for new graduates or co-op students?
- What experiences did you have that helped you work in this position?
- What kind of skills are essential for the type of work you are involved in?
- What are the typical next career steps for someone in your position?
- How do you suggest is the best way for me to go about my job search after I graduate?
- What other organizations do you suggest could be of help and I should interact with?
- Are there any specific skills you suggest that I develop while I'm still a student?
