

**Call for Papers:** “The Amish and Their Neighbors: A Multidisciplinary Conference” to be held at the Young Center for Anabaptist and Pietist Studies, Elizabethtown (Pa.) College, June 2-4, 2022. The international conference will highlight issues arising from interaction between Amish communities and wider society, including those in areas such as public health, government regulation, business and economic development, charitable work, land use and environmental issues, tourism, and civic involvement. Conference planners welcome proposals from scholars and practitioners working in disciplines such as social science, public policy, healthcare, and human services. Planners also welcome proposals on other aspects of Amish life, as well as ones related to other traditional Anabaptist groups. Proposals for presentations as well as poster sessions are acceptable. Send a clear statement of topic, methods, and significance (350 words or fewer) and a one-page résumé of the presenter by e-mail attachment to [amish2022@etown.edu](mailto:amish2022@etown.edu) by November 1, 2021. Screening committee decisions will be made by December 15, 2021.
