Jason Testart offered to answer any questions about DUO (two-factor authentication). These are the highlights:

- To be rolled out opt-in for O365 and OWA/Connect
- IST is developing documentation
- UBI key works well if you don't want to use your personal phone
- Smartphone app for Android/IOS
- Supports SMS
- Can get a UBI key for as low as \$20
- HR will eventually use two factor
- Will be announced in the next few weeks
- Once you opt in, you can't opt out
- Next steps – documentation for people that want to add DUO to their applications

Other security related updates from Jason:

- New HR system expected around Q1 2019. Jason spoke briefly about HR moving to Workday from PeopleSoft
- Google Chrome will start complaining about HTTP (vs HTTPS) in June

Other Business

There have been reported problems with managed WIFI users connecting to Eduroam – Investigation is underway

Discussion about problem in Arts lab where mobile devices would not map N: drive. – Investigation is underway

Jim: Math has seen problems with Windows 10 1709 start menu that can be fixed with a top-level permission change

Ravindri: IST is doing application testing with Windows 10 1709 until March, to be ready for April rollout

Hong: Should IST approve the 1709 upgrade on WSUS? Not at this time

Lowell - AHS used WSUS to roll out 1709. They will be moving to using a task sequence for upgrades so it can be scheduled

Jim – Windows Feature Updates are resetting settings that have previously been disabled. Will self correct if the setting is managed by a GPO

Lowell: looking for a method to remove some windows store apps in 1709

DaveA: Is working with Engineering on reverse DNS errors on CHORUS connected computers. Will provide WNAG with the event log ID to look for on Nexus connected machines

Jim: Asked how others were securely wiping SSD's and received input from other faculties and departments. SSD shredding is available on campus
