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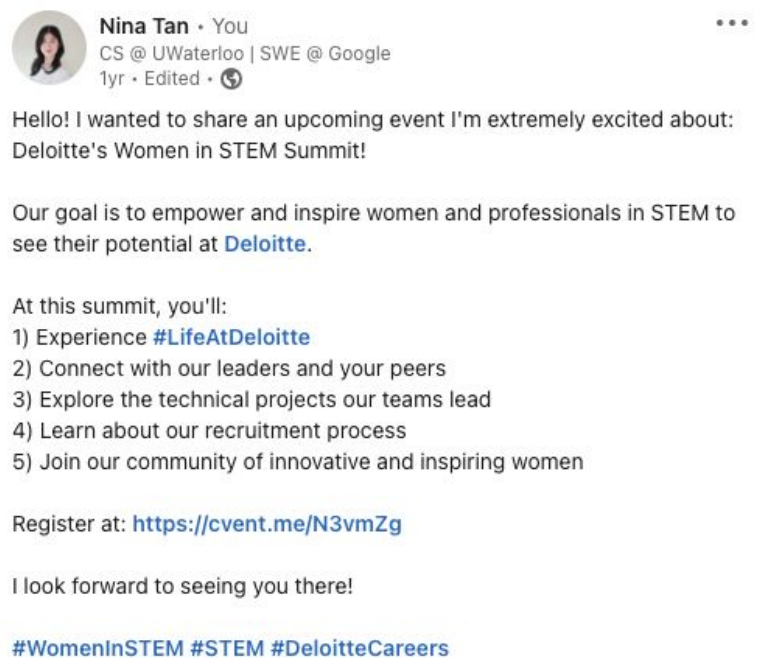

Before networking

- MVP on social media (Linkedin profile)
- UWaterloo email
- Elevator pitch

Setting up a meeting

- Make it easy for the other person
- Ask if they're willing to meet
- Offer to put time on their calendar
- Offer 3 dates and times you could meet
- Don't ask for > 30 minutes

After networking

- Take notes
- Follow up
- Thank them

What makes an effective network?
