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Value of WIL Research

- Deepen our understanding of our impact upon the academics with whom we work as well as providing a connection point with other stakeholders
- Contribute to the body of evidence providing rationale for our programs (within our institutions and advocacy with government and funding agencies)
- Contributing to own scholarly and professional development
- Fosters connections across institutions in the case of cross-institution research – global communities of practice
- Identify emerging trends in experiential education

Research – Early Stages

- Selecting a topic
- Identify population(s) impacted
- Conducting a literature review
- Identifying the research question(s)

Research – Early Stages – Example

Prompts?	Example *
What questions do I have? What am I interested in better understanding?	What makes for a quality co-op work term experience from the co-op supervisor's perspective?
What search terms should be used to identify relevant literature?	Supervisor satisfaction, student performance, co-operative education, internships, work-integrated learning
What research questions (RQs) could be used to investigate that topic?	What student attributes influence supervisors' satisfaction with a hired co-op student?

Research – Mid-stage

- Selecting an appropriate methodology
- Collecting and Analyzing Data
 - Will be very different depending on the research method(s) being used
- Determining Conclusions and Implications

Research – Mid-stage – Example

Prompts?	Example
What methodologies might be appropriate for exploring this RQ?	Online survey sent to co-op supervisors.
Where will I get data? If I have participants, who will they be and how will I select them?	Include all supervisors who have supervised at least one student from the university.
What data will I collect/analyze? What questions will I ask participants?	Co-op supervisors' ratings of: (1) importance of various student attributes; and (2) students' performance.
What techniques will I use to analyze the data?	Quantitative analyses: descriptive statistics, linear regression.

Research – Later-stage

- Identify Audiences
- Dissemination
 - Preparation of manuscripts
 - Preparation of presentations

Building a Community of Researchers (within or outside your institution)

- Connecting with colleagues doing Masters and PhD research in the field

Research – Our Tips

Sarah	Judene
Choose a topic you truly care about	 Start small and keep a list of possible future projects; look at what current research
 Keep topic/scope in mind with context & scope 	suggests are areas for future research
 Choose populations that you have easy access to 	 When selecting your topic and research question apply the "so what?" and "who cares?" test
Evaluate if they are at risk	 Identify a mentor or advocate
 Find a research partner and work together 	 Investigate ethics regulations for completing
 Consider using an instrument that is commercially available rather than developing one yourself 	research at your institution
