How do appointments work?

What can you work on with us?

Any academic writing or communication task, in any discipline, at any stage of the composition process. From first-year assignments to PhD dissertations, we've got your back! Even if you haven't written anything, we can work with you to help you understand your assignment and get started.

What happens in an appointment?

We start by learning more about you and about your work, goals, and questions. We then give you feedback on your work in progress or we support you while you brainstorm, draft, and revise. Your work is your own and you ultimately make the choices and decisions that serve your goals and strengthen your work. But we'll coach you to try new strategies, sharpen your writing and presentation skills, and stay motivated and on track. You'll leave the appointment with clear next steps and with resources and tools to help.

How do I book an appointment?

You can book in-person, virtual, and email appointments through our online booking system, WCOnline. Email appointments will give you asynchronous same-day feedback. You can join a virtual appointment from anywhere (we suggest a quiet spot for best results). In-person appointments are held in The Write Spot, 219 South Campus Hall.
